

How much should I spend on my project animal(s) this year? How many project animal(s) should I purchase this year? typical 4-H Livestock Sale income which can be significantly higher than market value. It is important for 4-Hers to recognize the realities of producing market animals in today's industries, as well as the importance of securing a buyer.
