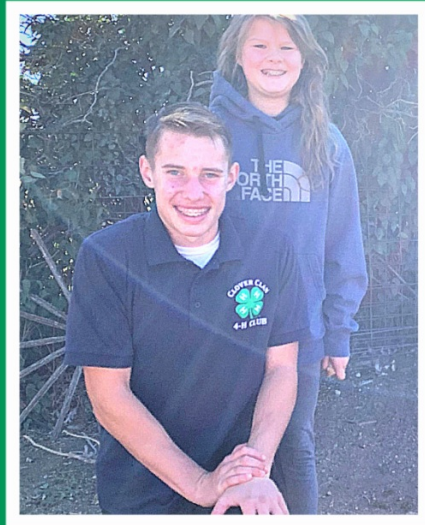
This is the official position of Colorado State University. As volunteers, staff, and members of the CSU community, we must follow this direction.

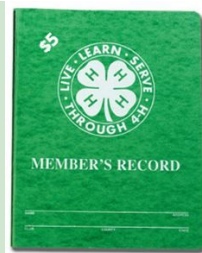
