What is it?

Youth sign-up to catch at a rodeo performance during the Stock Show. Successful youth receive their steer in May. The purchase price of the steer is covered by a sponsor. Youth write monthly letters to their sponsors and complete a monthly progress form that goes in their record book. They return to the Stock Show the following January to exhibit their steer, along with completing an interview and turning in their record book. The overall grand and reserve grand champion of the program are allotted a spot in the Junior Livestock Auction. Other youth will receive market value for their steer, along with a portion of what the two steers in the sale make.
