## COLORADO 4-H CODE OF CONDUCT

### CSU EXTENSION

*Note: Signed Code of Conduct can be found in 4HOnline, under profile information section.*

#### **4-H members, leaders, parents, and other adults participating in 4-H programs will:**

1. Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
2. Conduct themselves in a courteous, respectful manner, use appropriate language, exhibit good sportsmanship, and act as positive role models.
3. Abstain from illegal behaviors, use of alcohol, marijuana, illegal or illicit drugs, and tobacco including e-cigarettes and vaping device during 4-H events and activities.
4. Fully participate in scheduled activities.
5. Respect others property and privacy rights.
6. Respect the rights and authority of parents, leaders and Extension Agents.
7. Abstain from abuse (physical and/or verbal) and harassment.
8. Accept personal responsibility for behavior including any financial damage.
9. Be responsible for any financial damage caused by inappropriate behavior.
10. Adhere to principles and rules of safety.

Consequences for violating any part of this code of conduct may include, but are not limited to: removal from participation in the event in which the code of conduct has been violated (at the individual's expense); sanctions on participating in future 4-H events; forfeiture of financial support for the event; removal from offices held, etc. Behavior outside of 4-H activities can affect "member in good standing" or "volunteer in good standing" status.

It is the responsibility of all program participants to reinforce the code of conduct and intervene when necessary to enforce the rules.

**The 4H Foundation is including the term Citizen to our grant application. This term extends the 4H code of conduct to include your participation in your school and your community.**



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## 4H Foundation Grant Request Scoring Rubric

**Date:** 1 point if filled in

**Name/Age:** 1 point

**Club Name/years in 4H:** 1 point

**Name of Project/Event:** 1 point

**Start date/Approx. finish date:** 1 point

**Amount Requested:** 1 point

**Reason why you would like to create this project (what is educational, leadership, growth, etc., what skills are hoped to be gained:**

*3 points:* The skills are identified and direct connections are made between the project and/or event and the skill OR

*2 points:* Skills identified but connection to project is vague or nonexistent

*1 point:* No skills identified

*0 point -* blank

**Description of how the funds will be used:**

*2 points* if budget is reasonable and accurate (calculations shown when appropriate) & includes description of how the funds will be used

*1 point:* If the budget is missing information and/or missing description of how the funds will be used.

*0 points* if blank

**If Approved who should the check be made out to and where should the funds be sent:** 1 point

**Code of Conduct signed and dated:** 2 point

**Signature:** 1 point

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4H member can earn a total of 15 points on their Grant Request.

½ points can be given. For example Parent Signature & Date is worth 1 point but if one element is missing, such as the date the member can be given ½ point.

Zero points will be awarded for any category missing the required information.

Final score will be turned into a percentage. Final Score divided by 15. So if a member earned 13 points  $13/15 = 0.86 = 86\%$

The following 4H projects can be awarded the below amounts. This is a maximum amount of money awarded for a project. You DO NOT have to spend this maximum amount. You will only be reimbursed for the amount of receipts submitted (must be attached) to your grant application.
