

Attention livestock exhibitors! Are you showing a market animal at the 2025 National Western and want to earn \$1,000?! Apply to become a Meat and Greet participant!

The Meat & Greet is a foodie event that features Colorado proteins (beef, pork, lamb, and goat), Colorado kids (4-H and FFA Members), and responsibly raised livestock (cattle, lambs, hogs and goats) that will be on display in November and exhibited at the National Western Stock Show in January of 2025. This event creates a greater awareness of agriculture and the youth that exhibit at the National Western Stock Show through relationship-building between exhibitors and the professional demographic of the greater Denver metro area. This takes the National Western experience to a new level! Exhibitors and their animals will walk the runway and attendees can bid on a "Partner Experience" with that exhibitor and animal. Participants must send out regular communication with their experience buyers from the Meat and Greet through the National Western Stock Show. Buyers will also have the chance to visit with you and watch you exhibit your animal on your respective show day at the NWSS. Buyers will have a first-class experience at the NWSS as the Colorado FFA Foundation will host them on show day.

What do you get out of it? If you are chosen to be one of the exhibitors, you will receive a scholarship for \$1,000 upon the completion of the 2025 National Western Stock Show! All 4-H and FFA ages are able to apply! The Meat and Greet is an event put on by the Colorado FFA Foundation.
